November 28, 1943 - November 7, 2009

Michael Eugene Campbell died November 7, 2009, age 65, of lung cancer, after a brief illness. He was born in Decatur, Illinois, on November 28, 1943, to Alecia Margaret (Strong) Campbell and Dr. Thomas Joseph Campbell. He was a winner of several sailing awards, racing for many years throughout California, Florida, Illinois, and Michigan, which included the Lightning National and Red Flannel races out of Chicago, on Lake Michigan. He was also a past member of the International Lightning Class Association. An Inventor and engineer, Michael worked on the McDonnell Douglas prototype for the Phantom FG.1 Jet Fighter in St. Louis, Missouri; for the General Electric Robotics Division in Chatsworth, California; past President of Maro Precision Tool Co.; and owner of Flexible Automation Controls Tools and Systems. Michael lived life with extraordinary exuberance, and cherished his family and friends. He will be greatly missed. He is survived by his wife of thirty-six years: Patricia LuAnn (Paige) Campbell; son, Scott Lyle Campbell; Jennifer Alecia Paige Campbell; grandson, Logan Paige Campbell.
