



## Mrs. Linelle W. Young

September 9, 1910 - February 9, 2009

Linelle Young was born September 9, 1910 in Danville, Kentucky. She was one of six children born to Sue Minnie and George F. Walker. She received her early education in Clifton, Kentucky and was a graduate of Danville's Bates High School. Linelle made First Baptist Church her home and was baptized at the age of 16. She later moved to Dayton, Ohio and joined Bethel Baptist Church, where she taught Sunday School and sang in the choir. While in Dayton, Linelle met and married Charles T. Young in 1937. No children were born to this union. Linelle and Charles moved to Detroit and joined Tabernacle Baptist Church. Here she worked as a teacher in the Youth Division of Sunday School and served as director and member of the DUBS, Sorosis Guild and the Missionary Department. In 1959, the Youngs moved to Kalamazoo, Michigan and joined Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church, where Linelle worked faithfully for as long as her health permitted. She served as part of the Missionary Department, Deaconess Board, Sunday School, Church Women United, as well as other organizations. Preceding her in death were her parents; husband, Charles; her five siblings; their spouses; and several nieces and nephews.
