Roger J. Nabors departed this life on November 19, 2011 while at Rose Arbor Hospice in Kalamazoo, MI. Roger was born December 22, 1950 and was the fifth child of nine born to the late Clarence and Kathleen Nabors in Kalamazoo, Michigan. Roger gave his life to Lord under the leadership of Rev. Roberson at Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church. Roger was an excellent Usher on the Galilee Senior Usher Board, where he faithfully served for 20 years, until his health began to hinder him from fulfilling his duties. Roger was also active in sports, having gained letters for football and excelling in track, where he was known for his speed and talent in running the low hurdle event, while attending Kalamazoo Central H.S. Roger carried his athleticism as an adult, playing competitive softball for many years and was also an outstanding bowler. Roger was enlisted in the United States Army from 1972-1973 and was stationed in Korea for a tour of duty as a Medical Specialist. Roger was employed with Kalamazoo County where he worked as a Fireman for many years. Upon leaving the Kalamazoo Fire Department, he was employed with J. O. Galloup until he was unable to physically work any longer. Roger was and is known for his love for everyone, his comical behavior, brightening lives with his charisma and drawing people with his warming smile. Before Roger's illness took its toll, you could find him on the dance floor of ballrooms across the states, dancing from the first song to the very last, stepping, bopping, swirling, dipping and gliding with ease, as if he were a dancer on skates. Roger was a devoted father, grandfather, brother, uncle, cousin, friend and co-

worker who was loved and admired by all that knew him. He leaves to mourn his passing and celebrate his home going, two daughters, Maria Smith of Southfield, MI and Erika Thompson of Charlotte, N.C., one son, Erik Nabors of Kalamazoo, MI. Four granddaughters, Cachet Colvard, Kennedi Smith, Cameron Smith and Rhiley Gripper and one grandson Khalil Smith. Five sisters, Janice Crutcher, Portage, MI, Carol Nabors, Kalamazoo, MI, Bobbie Nabors, Nashville, TN, Kathie (Damond) Chenault , Kalamazoo, MI and Karen (William) Jackson, Seattle, WA. Two brothers, Douglass (Sandra) Nabors, of Laquey, MO and Michael (Sydni) Nabors of Bloomfield Hills, MI. He also leaves a host of nephews, nieces, great-nieces, great-nephews, cousins and a special aunt, Madge Taylor. “MANY WILL REMEMBER ROGER NABORS 11/24/2011

By William D. Jackson (Karen's Husband and Rogers Brother-in-Law)

I knew Roger Nabors, when we were just boys, before ever meeting him. He was more than a great athlete. As I saw him from a distance, he laughed a lot and really enjoyed life. I knew him in those days because Roger Nabors never harmed a soul. His laughter was always shared rather than targeted at someone.

Roger Nabors was a forward thinking fighter for justice. Later in university he would help lead a protest and take over the Student Union. I think they were protesting the Vietnam War. Though a champion for civil, human rights and justice he had the courage to serve his country, with distinction, when drafted and sent to Korea. Even in the service he continued to stand up for justice, at the high cost of some personal liberty and professional pain. Those wars killed many and harm many more survivors. Though Roger was a university Senior, when drafted, from one of the top Psychology School of the time, after the war, he would never finish college. I think he may have lost his faith in institutions in the face of greed that caused some wars and racism that sustained greed.

In 1979 God answered my fervent, prostrate (down on the floor) pray for an angel and allowed me to marry one of Rogers beautiful sisters, Karen Nabors (the baby girl/a twin). We would be married 20 years before she would slowdown accidentally calling me Roger. In fairness I often accidentally referred to her as a sister whom I loved.

My wife Karen loves her family with a special place in her heart for each one. Roger, her big brother was her hero. About Roger, Karen has a thousand stories she tells with great joy and laughter. In one story Karen would tell, from their youth, she was chasing after Roger and his friends as they all returned home from school. She would brag about how fast she was and that they could not get

away. One day a few years ago, Roger told us both, he always knew she was there, and he would never let the guy run so fast that he could not watch over her. And he laughed his trademark, full throated, toe tingling belly laugh. You had no choice but to join in his joy and love of life until tears sometimes came from your heart through your eyes. Roger could laugh like this, even through his painful illness, when most people would find no joy at all. What a man.

There is no end to Karen's instructions from Roger as the family Softball Coach. "If your glove touches that ball, you should catch it." Etc. Roger says, Roger says, Roger says. Says his baby sister, my wife Karen Nabors Jackson. Let us now hold all of these fond fun fragrant memories and share them with the children. They will help to keep us in these times of loss.

Roger was a good brother-in-law as well. He was never overly involved in our marriage, yet never too far from his baby sister. Karen and I have Friday nights dates. One of the best parts was calling Roger from the speakerphone in Karen's car as we drove. Roger would talk much smack, and we loved listening to him. Roger would make us laugh when lesser men would have been crying. Even as I wrote this letter, only moments after hearing of his departure, I thought to my self how much we would miss those conversations. And as I wrote, Rogers voice sounded in my head, as clear as if he were in our house, "No you won't miss those conversations, because I will be right here." Then he laughed his signature laugh. I laughed with him, thanked God for him and praise God that I had known him.

It is interesting how the oldest Nabors woman (Madge) and man (Roger) were the first to go to glory after Father and Mother Nabors. It is interesting to think of just the four of them together. After a brief meeting, Mother Nabors will return to traveling. Many will recall she said she was claiming her wings upon arrival. Madge may join her, but not without some books to read. Father Nabors will return to his rocking chair on the front porch of Heavens gates to continue
